Overview

Electronic ensemble performs, composes, and produces new electronic music. The group will explore various aspects of electronic music performance using synthesizers, computer, outboard processors, and various types of microphones and speakers.

Course Outcome

At the end of this class, members of the ensemble will:

- be able to setup and strike a stage for electronic music performance
- acquire skills to improvise and compose using synthesizer
- perform at least three electronic music pieces specifically composed for the ensemble.

Required Materials

- **Headphones:** 1/4" jack or 1/4" adapter is needed.

Expectations

- Come to every classes and labs on time and be ready to talk about the subject matter. Participation is a portion of your final grade. If you miss more than 6 hours of the class time without proper excuses, I reserve the right to drop you from the class. For every unexcused tardies to class beyond your third, I reserve the right to drop your final grade by 5% . If you miss more than 12 hours of class time, excused or unexcused, you will not be able to pass the class.
- If you know you can't make it to class or if some emergency keeps you from coming, please let me know. We'll make the needed arrangements. You are responsible for all material covered in the class regardless of your attendance record.
- You are required to attend and perform at the concert featuring the electronic music ensemble. No-show at the concert will result in failing the class.
